

# **South Pennine Moors Special Area of Conservation (SAC) / Special Protection Areas (SPAs) Joint Supplementary Planning Document**

## **Adoption Statement Tameside Council**

**This notice has been prepared in accordance with the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (as amended), the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended).**

Notice is hereby given that, in accordance with regulations 11, 12, 14 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012 (as amended) and Section 23 of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004 (as amended), Tameside Council has adopted the South Pennine Moors Special Area of Conservation (SAC) / Special Protection Areas (SPAs) Joint Supplementary Planning Document with effect from 08 May 2025.

Any person with sufficient interest in the decision to adopt the South Pennine Moors Special Area of Conservation (SAC) / Special Protection Areas (SPAs) Joint Supplementary Planning Document may make an application to the High Court for permission to apply for judicial review of that decision.

Any such application to the High Court must be made promptly and in any event not later than 3 months after the date on which the supplementary planning document was adopted (see above for adoption date).

The following modifications were made to the Supplementary Planning Document, pursuant to Section 23(1) of the Planning and Compulsory Purchase Act 2004, following consultation on the draft document, and these are summarised below in accordance with the requirements of Regulation 11(2)(b) of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012:

- A minor amendment to the supporting text to Supplementary Policy SP-1 Urban Edge to define householder development.
- Minor amendments to Supplementary Policy SP-2 Functionally Linked Habitats and the supporting text to: make it clearer that bird surveys should include breeding and winter bird surveys; that Lowland fen, and Lowland wet and dry heath and acid grassland could indicate the presence of foraging habitats; and to remove the reference to arable land as a land use that would rule out foraging habitats on the site, as arable land could support foraging birds.

In accordance with regulations 11, 12, 14 and 35 of the Town and Country Planning (Local Planning) (England) Regulations 2012, as soon as practicable after the date of adoption (08 May 2025), the following documents will be made available for inspection via the council's website
