- **[Budget Conversation 2021-22](#)** – Tameside Council (TMBC) and NHS Tameside and Glossop Clinical Commissioning Group (CCG) together form the Tameside and Glossop Strategic Commission. We are responsible for a range of services from bin collections through care for the elderly to the provision of GP surgeries.

Both Tameside Council and NHS Tameside and Glossop Clinical Commissioning Group have to set a balanced budget for 2021/22. The coronavirus pandemic has also resulted in significant financial challenges for the Strategic Commission, which now need to be addressed as part of our budget setting process.

To prepare a balanced budget a number of considerations have to be taken into account. The views of local people are important in helping us understand your priorities and informing the budget setting.

We are also hosting a number of public virtual engagement sessions to gather views of people in Tameside & Glossop. Participants will have the opportunity to share and discuss their priorities for the budget in 2021/22. Sessions will take place on:

- **[Improving Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic community experiences of mental health services](#)** – NHS England and NHS Improvement national mental health team is holding a series of webinars for patients, carers, health leaders, decision-makers, and senior clinical managers to discuss ways to improve experiences and outcomes of care for Black, Asian and Minority Ethnic (BAME) patients and carers in mental health services. This will help inform the development of the Patient and Carers Race Equality Framework (PCREF). - **Census 2021 jobs** – the next set of jobs for next year’s Census have been launched. Some of the upcoming vacancies are as follows:
  - Census officer – Working with the community and talking to people to champion the census, boost response rates and ensure residents have the right support to fill in their form.
  - Census team leader – Our team leaders oversee and coordinate the field operation in an assigned area, guiding a team of census officers and providing the tools and expertise they need to succeed.
  - Census area manager – Our managers will use their people skills to motivate and manage our team leaders, track their performance and ensure their teams visit addresses to help everyone complete the census.

- As we go through the recent lockdown, it may be the case that residents require advice and support from public or third sector services relating to Covid-19. The following list has been compiled to raise awareness of the support available to residents in Tameside & Glossop during this time – many of which are tailored to different needs. ### **Grant Funding for VCSE organisations**

There are a number of ways VCSE organisations in Greater Manchester and Derbyshire can apply for funding during the Covid-19 outbreak. 10GM, a partnership of local support and development agencies in Greater Manchester, have come together to produce a bulletin providing all the information on funding opportunities available for VCF organisations in Greater Manchester, including how to apply. Update on various funding pots available

- [Covid-19 Community-led Organisations Recovery Scheme](#) – This funding is designed to support organisations that work with those communities which have been disproportionately impacted by COVID-19, as well as social enterprises and community businesses.
- [GM Mental Wellbeing Grants](#) – GMCVO, working in partnership with 10GM, have launched a grants programme to support adults from communities of identity or experience, based in Greater Manchester; that may struggle to achieve higher levels of mental wellbeing.
- [Emergency grants for GM BAME Communities](#) – Between July and December 2020, grants will be available for GM BAME led VCSE organisations, with an annual income of under £10,000, to focus on emergency needs within BAME communities. The grants will fund new activities and services as well as the additional costs of adapting existing services due to COVID-19. The grants will also help counter the loss of fundraising income directly caused by the pandemic.
- [Emergency Investment Funds](#) – Has your company or organisation been negatively impacted by the Covid-19 crisis and been unable to access suitable or sufficient investment from existing support schemes such as the [Coronavirus Business Interruption Loan Scheme \(CBILS\)](#), the [Bounce Back Loan Scheme \(BBLs\)](#) or [SIB's Resilience and Recovery Loan Fund](#)? Whether you address social needs, strengthen communities, improve people's life chances, enhance culture or protect the environment - this opportunity is for you. If you are a social enterprise, a charity or a community business then you can apply for a loan of between £50,000 to £250,000 for a 5-year term to support you through the crisis.

### **Covid-19 opinion and behaviour insight:**

The following are some key statistics taken from different pieces of national and regional research indicating what the impact of covid-19 has been for people including businesses. Understanding the impact of Covid-19 will be crucial to our recovery locally and how we plan to build back better.

- 72% support returning to lockdown, compared to 93% in March
- The most compelling reasons to follow the government's rules are to protect friends and family (87%), vulnerable people (87%) and the NHS (87%)
- Mancunians are slightly less compliant with following government rules compared to the national average, but are just as compliant when it comes to test and trace rules
- 76% are worried about the effect of Covid on their life right now, up 12% from August
- Life satisfaction levels have hit their lowest point since the beginning of the pandemic, down from an average score of 7.2 (out of 10) in March to 6.7 in October

- 41% think the current restrictions are just right; 35% think they are not strict enough; and 24% think they are too strict
- Support for Covid measures largely correlates with how effective people think they will be, with a couple of exceptions: the rule of six, and 10pm curfew for pubs and restaurants are supported but not considered to be effective
- 93% of those who have made a journey by train in the past seven days felt safe, 7% did not

- [Inclusive Growth Strategy Consultation](#) – Tameside Council is reviewing its Inclusive Growth Strategy, a guiding document that sets out how the borough will ensure that the quality of life, health and happiness of our people is improved, by good employment, with greater security and better pay. It also states how the borough will support improved productivity which will benefit local businesses, and how it will effect proactive public service reform in a thriving, varied, inclusive economy. Anyone who lives, works or spends their time in Tameside is asked to review the draft document and give their comments and opinions. The closing date for this is **16 December 2020**.
- [Improving Access to Primary Care in Tameside & Glossop](#) – We need to make sure that we offer alternative ways for people to see their GP/Doctor/other healthcare professionals to meet the different need and requirements of people in Tameside and Glossop. This will ensure that local people are given as much choice as possible to access healthcare. Examples of other ways to access your GP/Doctor/other healthcare professional include online appointments/telephone appointments and video consultations.

The purpose of this survey is to find out what you, as a patient registered with a GP/Doctor's surgery in Tameside and Glossop, think of the alternative ways of seeing your GP/Doctor/other healthcare professional from your surgery. Deadline: **2 December 2020**.

- **A57 Link Roads Consultation** – Highways England have launched a consultation on the A57 Link Roads project and want to hear your views on the updated design of the proposed road.

- [Creating quieter and safer residential streets to support walking and cycling](#) – Residents' views are being sought on new schemes to create safer routes for walking and cycling. The first two schemes to be trialled in Tameside are at Currier Lane in Ashton, and Stamford Drive in Stalybridge. The plans for these two schemes can be found here. Direct engagement with residents, living adjacent to the schemes, has already begun. The closing date for this is **16 November 2020**.
- [COVID-19 survey](#) – Due to the outbreak of Coronavirus (COVID-19), we have all been asked to 'Stay at Home, Protect the NHS, and Save Lives'. This short survey from Healthwatch Tameside will help them to understand and gather information about what you think could make the situation easier to live with. They want you to say what is working well, as well as what could be improved. Paper copies of this consultation will be made available in due course, and questions can be talked through over the phone to support as many responses as possible. Deadline: **ongoing**.

#### Regional engagement and consultations

- [Greater Manchester Clean Air Plan](#) – Greater Manchester needs to take action to improve air quality now and for future generations. Air pollution is linked to a range of serious health conditions and contributes to early deaths. Government has directed us to introduce a Greater Manchester-wide Clean Air Zone. It will bring harmful nitrogen dioxide (NO<sub>2</sub>) levels on local roads within legal limits in as short a time as possible. GMCA / TfGM are consulting on key elements of the proposals, including the proposed Clean Air Zone boundary, daily charges for non-compliant vehicles, discounts and exemptions, and support funding.

- [Greater Manchester Minimum Licensing Standards](#) – GMCA / TfGM want to see taxi and private hire services in Greater Manchester deliver a safer, high-quality experience for everyone, every time, using vehicles that meet high environmental standards. Greater Manchester's 10 local councils, supported by Transport for Greater

Manchester (TfGM), have worked to develop a proposed set of common, minimum standards for services licensed in Greater Manchester. We are now consulting on the proposed standards and want you to have your say.

### National engagement and consultations

There are currently a number of pieces of engagement and /or consultation work being led by Government departments / agencies that you may wish to take part in. For further information and to have your say please follow the relevant links below:

- [Ethnic disparities and inequality in the UK: call for evidence](#) – The Commission on Race and Ethnic Disparities We have been asked by the government to review ethnic disparities and inequality in the UK, focusing on 4 areas. We are looking at outcomes across the whole population. They are particularly keen to hear from: the public and local communities; public, private and third sector organisations; and researchers and academics. Responses are welcome from: the public and local communities; public, private and third sector organisations; researchers and academics; and others who wish to share their views. The closing date is **30 November 2020**.
- [Improving health and wellbeing support for armed forces families in England](#) – The NHS in England provides healthcare services for families of serving personnel (regular and reserve) who have registered with an NHS GP practice and the families of veterans. Whilst most armed forces families enjoy healthy lives, the unique circumstances of military life can cause pressure for some, and affect an individual's health and wellbeing. NHS England want to help change this, so armed forces families are able to access local NHS services easily in all parts of England. They also want to ensure that they can get care and support from clinicians and people who understand their health and wellbeing needs. This questionnaire is an opportunity for people and organisations to share their views on how they can do this. The closing date for this is **30 November 2020**.
- [Raising accessibility standards for new homes](#) – This consultation considers how to raise accessibility standards, recognising the importance of suitable homes for older

and disabled people.

In particular, it considers how the existing optional accessible and adaptable standard for homes and the wheelchair user standard are used and whether government should mandate a higher standard or reconsider the way the existing optional standards are used. Deadline: **1 December 2020**.

- [Covid-19 and Maternity Services in the UK](#) – The Fatherhood Institute would like to know how services have been managing fathers’/ partners’ roles in supporting mothers through their perinatal journey, and how families have coped (and/or are coping) with the restrictions. Expectant and new parents are invited to respond, as well as those who work for NHS maternity services.
- [Managing Pavement Parking](#) – Consultation asking whether a change of existing pavement parking legislation should occur. The Department for Transport are proposing 3 options:
  - Improving the Traffic Regulation Order (TRO) process, under which local authorities can already prohibit pavement parking.
  - A legislative change to allow local authorities with civil parking enforcement powers to enforce against ‘unnecessary obstruction of the pavement’.
  - A legislative change to introduce a London-style pavement parking prohibition throughout England.

The deadline for this is **22 November 2020**.

- [LGBT Sport & Physical Activity Group Coronavirus Impact Survey](#) – With this survey Pride Sports would like to get an idea of how the coronavirus lockdown has affected LGBT+ sports clubs, not just in terms of providing sports and physical activity, but also other aspects such as social events and the governance of clubs. Deadline: **ongoing**.
- [Healthy Start Vouchers](#) – The NHS Business Services Authority (NHSBSA) would like to hear about your experience of applying for, and using, the Healthy Start scheme. Your feedback will allow us to review and shape the future of Healthy Start.

It will take around ten minutes to complete the survey. Please do not include any personal or identifiable information. All the information you provide will be treated as strictly confidential and individuals will not be identifiable in any report we write. This survey is **ongoing**.

- [Integrating Care for Trans Adults](#) – This survey is being undertaken by researchers from the Open University, the LGBT Foundation and Yorkshire MESMAC as part of a larger study. In this study we are looking at how different services can work together

to support trans people better. These services include gender identity services but could also include GP services, other health services, mental health services and support provided by the voluntary sector.
