### ASHTON HURST Ashton-under-Lyne constituency

ASHTON HURST has an electorate of 8671 and is mostly part of the Ashton-under-Lyne constituency. The Ward is made up of 6 polling districts with 5 polling stations. There is one small district of 2 properties as they vote with their old ward in the Stalybridge and Hyde constituency. There are currently 2049 electors registered for postal votes, resulting in 6622 electors who could vote in polling stations. If we proceed with 5 polling stations, this would create an average of 1734 (1324 in person) electors per station. If the stations remain unchanged, the table below illustrates the potential turnout at each polling station within the ward:

Broadoak and Smallshaw Community Centre will be a double polling station for national and combined elections.

Feedback on the suitability of polling stations from Polling Station Inspectors and Presiding Officers did not suggest any problems with the current arrangements.

Since our last review, Hurst Knoll St James have requested that an alternative be sought, due to a change in use for the building that is used for polling. We welcome any feedback or suggestions for alternatives to see if this would be possible.

Consideration must be given to where HURST3A voters should vote for UK Parliamentary elections, as they are in the Stalybridge and Hyde constituency.

# ASHTON ST MICHAEL'S Ashton-under-Lyne constituency

ASHTON ST MICHAEL'S has an electorate of 9,193 and is part of the Ashton-under-Lyne constituency. The Ward is made up of 5 polling districts with 5 polling stations. There are currently 2,029 electors registered for postal votes resulting in 7,164 electors who could vote in polling stations. If we proceed with 5 polling stations, this would create an average of 1838 (1432 in person) electors per station. If the stations remain unchanged, the table below illustrates the potential turnout at each polling station within the ward:

Feedback on the suitability of polling stations from Polling Station Inspectors and Presiding Officers did not suggest any problems.

The New Life Church has been unable to offer space in the building for a polling station due to other commitments. We have used a unit on their carpark as a temporary measure. We welcome any feedback or suggestions for a permanent alternative within the polling district is welcomed due to the unsuitability of mobile units.

# ASHTON WATERLOO Ashton-under-Lyne constituency

ASHTON WATERLOO has an electorate of 9,274 and is part of the Ashton-under-Lyne constituency. The Ward is made up of 5 polling districts with 5 polling stations. There are currently 2,085 electors registered for postal votes resulting in 7,189 electors who could vote in polling stations. If we proceed with 5 polling stations, this would create an average of 1854 (1437 in person) electors per station. If the stations remain unchanged, the table below illustrates the potential turnout at each polling station within the ward:

In 2022, the ward had some changes, as we split WAT2 to even out the electorate and create an additional convenient polling place for half the district. This was when Richmond Community Centre was added. This has worked well and is now an established polling location.

Feedback on the suitability of polling stations from Polling Station Inspectors and Presiding Officers did not suggest any problems.

An alternative to the Mobile polling station on the Crowhill Rd/ Patterdale Rd junction is sought due to the high electorate and the unsuitability of mobile units.

Waterloo primary has formally requested we find an alternative polling place to avoid disruption to school on polling day. We welcome any feedback or suggestions for alternatives to see if this would be possible.

# AUDENSHAW Ashton-under-Lyne constituency

AUDENSHAW has an electorate of 9,837 and is mostly part of the Ashton-under-Lyne constituency. The Ward is made up of 8 polling districts with 6 polling stations. There are currently 2,115 electors registered for postal votes resulting in 7,722 electors who could vote in polling stations. If we proceed with 6 polling stations, this would create an average of 1639 (1287 in person) electors per station. If the stations remain unchanged, the table below illustrates the potential turnout at each polling station within the ward:

Audenshaw falls mainly within Ashton-under-Lyne constituency under new constituency boundaries. There is a fairly even geographical spread of polling stations and electors. The exception to this would be AUD1, with an electorate of 522 served by Poplar Street Primary School. We have not looked to change this as the school is on the border and is also used as a polling station for St Peters Ward.

Aldwyn Primary School and Audenshaw Primary School will be considered to be made double polling stations for national and combined elections.

Feedback on the suitability of polling stations from Polling Station Inspectors and Presiding Officers did not suggest any problems with the current arrangements. Proposals are to keep all above locations.

Consideration must be given to where AUD2A and AUD6A voters should vote for UK Parliamentary elections, as they are in the Gorton and Denton constituency.

### DENTON NORTH EAST Gorton and Denton constituency

DENTON NORTH EAST has an electorate of 8,738 and is mostly part of the Gorton and Denton constituency. The Ward is made up of 6 polling districts with 5 polling stations. There are currently 1,872 electors registered for postal votes resulting in 6,866 electors who could vote in polling stations. The Ward was split successfully in the recent review and has a much more even spread across the ward, with the exception of DUK3.

Old Hall Chapel has not been available for some time and looks unlikely to be used as a community space in future. Whilst mobile units have been a temporary solution, we must consider which fixed, accessible site we use for polling in DUK2. We cannot continue to use mobiles (which are costly and not accessible / large enough for all) whilst there are other sites available. We used I-train for the Parliamentary, and from staff accounts, this worked well and met key accessibility criteria.

Feedback on the overall suitability of the rest of the polling stations from Polling Station Inspectors and Presiding Officers did not suggest any problems with the arrangements in July.

An alternative to the Mobile unit at Park Road is sought due to its low electorate and an effort to cut the number of mobiles due to their unsuitability.

Suggestion that I-Train to be made the permanent polling station for DUK2. Where there are any objections to this proposal, alternative suggestions for another permanent suitable location would be welcomed.

Consideration as to where DUK3A electors should vote for UK Parliamentary elections, as they are in the Stalybridge and Hyde constituency.

### DUKINFIELD/STALYBRIDGE Stalybridge and Hyde Constituency

Rayner Stephens has made a request that an alternative be sought to the school if possible and suggested approaching nearby primary school or church. Alternative suggestions for another permanent suitable location would be welcomed.

Alternative sought for mobile at the Arcade due to its low electorate and an effort to cut the number of mobiles due to their unsuitability.

Consideration as to where DUK/ST1A and DUK/ST3A electors should vote for UK Parliamentary elections, as they are in the Ashton-under-Lyne constituency.

# HYDE GODLEY Stalybridge and Hyde Constituency

No changes or considerations are proposed, but we welcome feedback from stakeholders within Longdendale.

# MOSSLEY Stalybridge and Hyde Constituency

MOSSLEY has an electorate of 8,767 and is part of the Stalybridge and Hyde Constituency. The Ward is made up of 5 polling districts with 5 polling stations. There are currently 1,903 electors registered for postal votes resulting in 6,864 electors who could vote in polling stations. If we proceed with 5 polling stations, this would create an average of 1753 (1372 in person) electors per station. If the stations remain unchanged, the table below illustrates the potential turnout at each polling station within the ward:

Mossley remains wholly within the Stalybridge and Hyde constituency. There is a fairly even geographical spread of polling stations and electors.

Feedback on the suitability of polling stations from Polling Station Inspectors and Presiding Officers did not suggest any problems with the current arrangements, with the exception of the mobile unit.

The mobile polling station used in MOSS5 is situated on private land where we have to pay further charges.

Mossley Youth Base and George Lawton Hall will be double polling stations for national and combined elections.

Alternative sought to the Mobile at Roaches lock in an effort to cut the number of mobiles due to their unsuitability.

# ST PETERS Ashton-under-Lyne

ST PETERS has an electorate of 9,387 and is part of the Ashton-under-Lyne Constituency. The Ward is made up of 7 polling districts with 7 polling stations. There are currently 1,777 electors registered for postal votes resulting in 7,610 electors who could vote in polling stations. If we proceed with 7 polling stations, this would create an average of 1341 (1087 in person) electors per station. If the stations remain unchanged, the table below illustrates the potential turnout at each polling station within the ward:

A mobile has been used on West End primary whilst building work has been taking place. We will be back in the school for next scheduled polls.

Holy Trinity Community Centre and West End Methodist Church Hall would be considered for double polling stations for national and combined elections.

No changes or considerations are proposed, but we welcome feedback from stakeholders within St Peters.

### STALYBRIDGE NORTH Stalybridge and Hyde Constituency

STALYBRIDGE NORTH has an electorate of 9,342 and is part of the Stalybridge and Hyde Constituency. The Ward is made up of 5 polling districts with 5 polling stations. There are currently 2,019 electors registered for postal votes resulting in 7,323 electors who could vote in polling stations. If we proceed with 5 polling stations, this would create an average of 1868 (1464 in person) electors per station. If the stations remain unchanged, the table below illustrates the potential turnout at each polling station within the ward:

For the 2024 elections we had to move from the fire station as the community room was no longer available. Following consultation with members, the 2<sup>nd</sup> Stalybridge Scout hut off Stamford Drive was proposed. This worked well in polls this year and meets necessary criteria for a polling station.

Feedback from Polling Station Inspectors and Presiding Officers following elections did not suggest any problems with any of the existing polling locations.

St George's Church and Ridge Hill Children's Centre will be considered double polling stations for national and combined elections.

Other than confirming the permanent change in station to the 2<sup>nd</sup> Stalybridge Scout hut for STNTH1, no changes or considerations are proposed. However, we do still welcome feedback from stakeholders within Stalybridge North.

# STALYBRIDGE SOUTH Stalybridge and Hyde Constituency

STALYBRIDGE SOUTH has an electorate of 9,077 and is part of the Stalybridge and Hyde Constituency. The Ward is made up of 5 polling districts with 5 polling stations. There are currently 2,110 electors registered for postal votes resulting in 6,967 electors who could vote in polling stations. If we proceed with 5 polling stations, this would create an average of 1815 (1393 in person) electors per station. If the stations remain unchanged, the table below illustrates the potential turnout at each polling station within the ward:
